Update & News from the Surgery

We would like to share with you the latest updates and news direct from the surgery that we received in a recent meeting. From Adarsh Mehta, the Practice Manager:

- There is a slight staff shortage in the reception area due to illness, but we have a brilliant temp who is filling the gap; we have a new admin member helping to update records which is a big help; and one of the nurses is reducing hours but these hours are being filled by the team.
- One of the biggest issues with the new wider staffing of the PCN (Primary Care Network)
 is that of clinical space we are working on this but housing the new staff adequately is
 quite a task.
- We continue to recognise the issues experienced with the existing, outdated telephone system. We are nearing completion on funding and contractual arrangements that might enable a new, more robust telephone system to be installed in 2024.
- The Friends have made a contribution to the new heating boilers at Davenport House as the previous boiler had been condemned, needing a complete and immediate replacement. This is very much appreciated by the Practice team.
- PCN all three surgeries continue to work well together and are hoping to continue the focus on best practice development. Note that the PCN is one of only 29 in the country that is part of the pilot collaboration scheme.
- If anyone is not using the NHS App it is definitely worth a try as brings all your information and records processed at the surgery to your fingertips. - The L&D refurbishment is heading for a finale sometime in the second half of next year
 all good.
- The next big challenge, once this is complete, will be reducing waiting lists.
- The Maternity Unit is awaiting a CQC report in early January.

Dr Bethan Rees (of The Elms & Clinical Director for the PCN) gave a super talk about the success/future of our local PCN at Katherine Warington School on 19 September. She explained how our three surgeries now work together and share specialist resources in Chiropody, Diabetes, Paramedics, etc. — contributing to the space issues! She also explained how shared data and ideas have been very useful with the GPIP (GP Improvement Programme) where all three surgeries share data and best practice.
